The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking issuance of appropriate directions to official respondents to put up challan after completion of the investigation in case bearing FIR No.44 dated 14.08.2023 under Sections 406/498-A of IPC registered at Police Station Sector 17, Chandigarh (Annexure P-4).

Learned counsel for the petitioners *inter alia* contends that marriage of petitioner No.1 with respondent No.4 was solemnized on 02.02.2008 in accordance with Sikh rites and ceremonies. After the marriage, respondent No.4 started demanding house hold goods for setting up the house in Gurgaon, on account of which, mother of petitioner No.1 gave Rs.1 lakh in cash to respondent No.4 for buying necessary articles. Thereafter, respondent No.4 and his other family members started harassing, torturing and threatening petitioner No.1 on false and flimsy grounds. Further, in this regard, petitioner No.1 moved a detailed representation dated 28.01.2022 to DGP, Chandigarh

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(Annexure P-1), thereafter, her representation was marked to ASI Satyawar of Women Cell but from the very beginning, the said ASI along with his colleagues were against the petitioners and their behaviour was partial in favour of respondent No.4, therefore, petitioner No.1 was constrained to file an application dated 07.07.2022 (Annexure P-2) for changing of I.O. but again no action has been taken by the police authority. Further, the petitioner has approached this Court by way of filing CRM-M-56124-2022 and the same was dismissed as withdrawn with liberty to take recourse to the remedy as available to the petitioners in accordance with law (Annexure P-3). The petitioner has filed an application under Section 156(3) Cr.P.C. for registration of FIR against respondent No.4 and his family members which was allowed vide order dated 22.05.2023 and FIR No.44 dated 14.08.2023 under Sections 406/498-A of IPC was registered at Police Station Women Police Station Sector 17, Chandigarh (Annexure P-4) but not action has been taken against respondent No.4 and therefore, petitioner No.1 moved representation dated 27.08.2024 (Annexure P-5) to respondent No.2 in this regard but again no action has been taken so far.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners would be satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to consider and decide the representation dated 27.08.2024 (Annexure P-5) submitted by the petitioners in a time bound manner.

Notice of motion to the official respondents only.

Mr. Manish Bansal, P.P., U.T. Chandigarh, puts in appearance and accepts notice on behalf of the official respondents-State. Learned counsel for the petitioners is directed to supply copy of complete paper book to learned State counsel during the course of the day.

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Keeping in view the prayer made by the petitioners and without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to consider and decide the representation dated 27.08.2024 (Annexure P-5) submitted by the petitioners within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order, in accordance with law.
