SHEEL NAGU, CHIEF JUSTICE (Oral)

1. This is a petition for grant of anticipatory bail filed by the petitioners, who are two in number and are alleged with offences punishable under Sections 148, 149, 323, 324, 341, 326 and 506 IPC registered at Police Station Rampura, District Rewari, vide FIR No. 136 dated 21.06.2024, to which offence under Section 326 IPC was added lateron, arising out of an incident where there was an altercation between the complainant party and the accused, where petitioners threatened the prosecution witnesses of dire consequences, if they deposed against them in the Court in respect of an earlier offence registered against them vide FIR No. 267 of 2022, Police Station Rampura.



2. Though counter cases have been registered against both the parties, but the petitioners allegedly inflicted grievous injury to one of the injured persons, which turned out to be a fracture. The said injury is attributed to petitioner No.1 Gaurav alias Gaurav Kumar, whereas petitioner No.2 Bahadur Singh was armed with an iron rod and allegedly took active participation in the entire incident.
3. Consequently, in view of active participation of the petitioners in the incident and petitioner No.2 Bahadur Singh having criminal antecedents, prayer of the petitioners for grant of anticipatory bail is rejected.
4. Accordingly, petition stands dismissed.
