1. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to official respondents to disburse terminal benefits of her son Dilpreet Singh Shergill.

3. The petitioner is mother of Dilpreet Singh Shergill who was serving with Punjab Police as Deputy Superintendent of Police and unfortunately passed away on 22.02.2024. As per petitioner, there was matrimonial dispute between deceased employee and his wife i.e. respondent No. 7. During the lifetime of petitioner's son, the daughter of the petitioner had lodged a complaint against deceased's wife. The said complaint was withdrawn on account of compromise between the deceased and his wife. The petitioner further claims that deceased during his life time changed nomination in the official record and substituted name of his wife with the name of petitioner. The petitioner has made multiple representations before Authorities claiming that she should be released retiral/terminal benefits of her deceased son. The respondents have not decided her claim till date.



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- 4. Mr. Aman Dhir, DAG, Punjab, who on advance notice is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of respondent-State and waives service. He assures the Court that Competent Authority would look into the matter and decide claim of petitioner and respondent No. 7 in accordance with law.
- 5. Disposed of accordingly.
- 6. Let the needful be done within 6 weeks from today.
