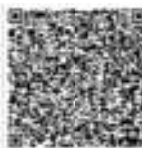

1. This order shall dispose of both the above-mentioned petitions arising out of impugned FIR and its cross-version case/DDR.

2. Both the afore-mentioned petitions have been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.0025 dated 29.05.2024

registered under Sections 307/323/341/34 IPC at Police Station Jhander,

District Amritsar Rural and its cross case bearing GD No.015 dated 31.05.2024 under Sections 323/324/341/34 alongwith all the consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise (Annexure P-2).

3. Vide orders dated 19.09.2024 and 29.10.2024, this Court had directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Magistrate for getting their statements recorded with respect to the compromise dated 25.06.2024 (Annexure P-2).

4. Pursuant to aforesaid orders, the parties have appeared before the learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Ajnala and got their statements recorded. A report dated 19.11.2024 has been received whereby after recording the statements of the parties, the Court below has shown its satisfaction that the compromise is genuine, voluntary and without any coercion or undue influence.

5. I have heard counsel for the parties and gone through the case file.

6. In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court below and considering the offence for which the accused have been charged are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out the differences for betterment of future life of the parties and also in view of the law laid down in **Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another, 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543** and **Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052**, the present petition for quashing the FIR is allowed qua the petitioners.

7. Resultantly, FIR No.0025 dated 29.05.2024 registered under Sections 307/323/341/34 IPC at Police Station Jhander, District Amritsar Rural and its cross case bearing GD No.015 dated 31.05.2024 under Sections 323/324/341/34 alongwith all consequential proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed qua the petitioners.
