By way of present petition filed under Section 438 CrPC,
petitioners seek anticipatory bail in case FIR (Annexure P-1) as under:

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that in compliance to the order dated 15.10.2024 passed by this Court, the petitioners have already joined the investigation and as such interim bail granted to the petitioners may be confirmed.
3. Learned State counsel, on instructions received from ASI



Balwant Singh has intimated that the petitioners have joined investigation and are no more required for any custodial investigation in this case nor they are required for further investigation.

4. Heard.

5. During the course of hearing on 15.10.2024, the following order was passed:-

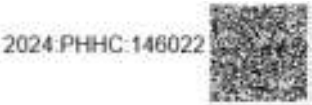
“3. It is, inter alia, contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that although the petitioner is named in the FIR but no specific overt act is attributed to the petitioner and the petitioner is having only one case registered against him. He is ready to join the investigation.

4. Learned State counsel, on the basis of reply submitted by the State, has not disputed the fact that no specific overt act is attributed to the petitioner.

5. List on 08.11.2024.

6. In the meanwhile, the petitioner is hereby directed to join investigation within seven days from today and in the event of his arrest, he is ordered to be released on interim bail on his furnishing personal/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer. He shall also abide by conditions as envisaged under Section 482 (2) of BNSS, 2023.”

6. Keeping in view the above submissions made by learned State counsel and the fact that the petitioners had joined the investigation consequent to the order dated 15.10.2024 passed by this Court, interim bail granted vide order dated 15.10.2024 is hereby confirmed, subject to conditions as envisaged under Section 482(2) BNSS. Further the petitioners are directed to join investigation as and when required in future by way of written notice for such purpose to be served by Investigating Officer of this case upon the petitioners; they will not tamper with the evidence nor will



influence the witnesses and will not leave the country without prior permission of the Court.

7. The petition stands allowed.
