1. Status report by way of an affidavit of Kanwardeep Kaur, IPS, Senior Superintendent of Police, U.T. Chandigarh filed on behalf of the respondents is taken on record along with Annexures R1/1 to R1/9.
2. Counsel appearing on behalf of U.T., Chandigarh submits that the allegations made in the present petition are totally false and actually, petitioner was caught while he was appearing in an examination for the post of Assistant Sub Inspector in Chandigarh Police, in place of another candidate namely Aashish Malik and FIR No.274 dated 27.08.2023 was registered against him, wherein he was arrested and later on granted regular bail. Counsel for U.T. submits that even thereafter another FIR has been registered against the present petitioner wherein he was found involved in a bigger conspiracy with regard to some other recruitment scam in fire brigade department. Counsel for U.T. further submits that prior to that the petitioner

was involved in one another FIR Annexure R/1/2 registered at Sonapat. Counsel for U.T. further submits that even otherwise, the present petition deserves to be dismissed on the ground that petitioner has already availed efficacious remedy under Section 156(3) Cr.P.C. by filing complaint Annexure R1/7.

3. In light of the above, coupled with the fact that today, there is no representation on behalf of the petitioner, the present petition is hereby dismissed.
