MAHABIR SINGH SINDHU, J.

Present petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India read with Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for issuance of a writ in the nature of *mandamus* directing official respondent Nos. 2 & 3 for protection of life and liberty of the petitioners.

(2) In response of notice of motion issued on 04.10.2023, status report by way of affidavit has already been filed by learned State counsel. Para Nos. 2 & 3 of the status report reads as under:-

“2. That in compliance of interim order dated 04.10.2023 passed by this Hon’ble Court the Station House Officer, Police Station Sadar, Narwana conducted an enquiry through ASI Balwan Singh of Police Station Sadar Narwana. The perusal of the enquiry report transpire that on the complain of Mr. Piare Lal son of Sh. Surja, father of the petitioner No. 1-Mamta, a case FIR No. 205 dated 30.09.2023 under Section 346 IPC has been registered at Police Station Garhi regarding missing of the petitioner No.1-Mamta from the intervening night of 28.09.2023 which is pending investigation.

3. That the petitioners have not joined the investigation of the aforementioned case as their whereabouts are not known. Since the



whereabouts of the petitioners are not known then they could not be joined in the enquiry. Further the respondent Nos. 4 to 9, who are family members of the petitioner No.1-Mamta i.e. father, brother, uncles and cousin, were joined in the enquiry on 28.10.2023 by ASI Balwant Singh of police Station Sadar Narwana and their statement were also recorded. They made similar statement that they have no objection from the marriage of the petitioners and there is no apprehension of danger to the petitioners from their side and no threat is being extended by them.”

- (3) Perusal of the above extract reveals that police official has recorded statements of both the petitioners and as on today, there is no threat to their life and liberty.
- (4) In view of the above, present petition stands disposed off.
- (5) Needless to say that petitioners would be at liberty to avail remedy available under law, if an occasion so arises.
- (6) Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
