The Prayer in this petition under Section 482 Cr.PC is for the quashing of the FIR No.0213 dated 09.09.2021 under Sections 324 IPC registered at P.S. Kotwali Nabha, District Patiala and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise dated 30.07.2022 (Annexure P-2) entered into between the parties.

Vide order dated 11.10.2023/19.12.2023 this Court had directed the parties to appear before Illaqa Magistrate for getting their statements recorded in terms of certain parameters given in the aforesaid order dated 11.10.2023 with regard to the compromise dated 30.07.2022 (Annexure P-2).

In terms of the order dated 11.10.2023/19.12.2023 passed by

this Court parties have appeared before the court of Ms. Anuradha, Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Nabha, District Patiala and as per report dated 25.01.2024 submitted to this Court, both the parties have got recorded their respective statements in Court.

Perusal of the aforesaid report would show that the parties have effected a genuine compromise without there being any pressure, coercion or undue influence. In view of the compromise there is a remote possibility of the complainant coming forward to support the prosecution case. The powers under Section 482 Cr.PC can be exercised in such like situation in order to prevent unnecessary vagaries of criminal trial to be faced by the parties, when there are remote chances of conviction of the accused. The compromise in question is found to be fully in consonance with the direction issued by the Court in *Kulwinder Singh & Ors. Vs. State of Punjab 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 and Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab & Anr., 2012(4) RCR (Crl.) 543.*

In view of the aforesaid report of the learned Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Nabha, District Patiala accompanied by statements of both the parties, the FIR No.0213 dated 09.09.2021 under Sections 324 IPC registered at P.S. Kotwali Nabha, District Patiala and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed.

Petition stands disposed of.
