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**KULDEEP TIWARI, J. (Oral)**

1. A co-ordinate Bench of this Court on 27.09.2024 passed the following orders:-

“The petitioner, who is a woman, apprehends her arrest in respect of offence punishable under Section 302 read with Section 34 of the Indian Penal Code and 27/54/59 of the Arms Act, in FIR No. 156 dated 28.09.2022 registered at Police Station Jhabhal, District Tarn Taran.

2. The incident, which took place on 28.09.2022, reveals that on a property dispute between the father-in-law and the husband of the petitioner, the petitioner exhorted her husband Dilbagh Singh to kill her father-in-law. Main accused Dilbagh Singh i.e. husband of the petitioner, had caused a fire arm injury to Raghbir Singh, who died at the spot.



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3. Considering the aforesaid and the fact that the petitioner is a woman aged about 50 years and the only allegation against her is of extortion and there are no criminal antecedents against her, this Court is inclined to grant the benefit of interim anticipatory bail to the petitioner subject to her furnishing bail bonds for a sum of Rs. 1,00,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join investigation as and when called upon to do so and cooperate with the Arresting/Investigating Officer and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.

4. This order shall also be subject to the following condition:-

i) The petitioner shall plant 10 saplings of indigenous plants each at a public place and submit proof in that regard by way of photographs before the Registry before the next date of hearing, failing which the Registry is directed to place the matter before the appropriate Bench where the Bench may consider recall of the order.

5. List on 28.10.2024.”

2. Thereupon this Court on 28.10.2024 directed the petitioner to cause her appearance in pursuance of summoning order passed under Section 319 Cr.P.C. before the learned trial Court concerned within 15 days thereafter.

3. Today, learned counsel for the petitioner has placed on record a photocopy of an order dated 08.11.2024 passed by the learned Principal District & Sessions Judge, Tarn Taran, to submit that the petitioner in



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pursuance of directions issued by this Court on 28.10.2024, has caused appearance and has been granted the relief of interim bail. He further submits that the petitioner has already made an application to demonstrate that she has planted 10 saplings in different regions. The submissions so made by learned counsel for the petitioner is not refuted by learned State counsel.

4.            In view of the above, the present petition is **allowed** and the interim directions passed by a co-ordinate Bench, vide order dated 27.09.2024 is hereby, made absolute subject to the condition that the petitioner shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
