The prayer in this petition is for quashing of FIR No.179 dated 17.10.2015 under Sections 323, 324, 341, 506, 148 and 149 IPC (Sections 193, 194, 195, 196 and 199 IPC added later on) registered at Police Station Sultanpur Lodhi, District Kapurthala and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 02.09.2023 (Annexure P- 3).

Vide order dated 11.10.2023 this Court had directed the parties to appear before Illaqa Magistrate for getting their statements recorded in terms of certain parameters given in the aforesaid order dated 11.10.2023 with regard to the compromise (Annexure P-3).

In terms of the order dated 11.10.2023 passed by this Court parties have appeared before the court of Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate,

Sultanpur Lodhi, and as per the report dated 02.02.2024 submitted to this

Court, both the parties have got recorded their respective statements in Court.

A perusal of the aforesaid report would show that the parties have effected a genuine compromise without there being any pressure, coercion or undue influence. In view of the compromise there is a remote possibility of the complainant coming forward to support the prosecution case. The powers under Section 482 Cr.PC can be exercised in such like situation in order to prevent unnecessary vagaries of criminal trial to be faced by the parties, when there are remote chances of conviction of the accused. The compromise in question is found to be fully in consonance with the direction issued by the Court in *Kulwinder Singh & Ors. Vs. State of Punjab 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 and Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab & Anr., 2012(4) RCR (Crl.) 543.*

In view of the aforesaid report of the Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Sultanpur Lodhi, accompanied by the joint statement of both the parties, the present FIR No. 179 dated 17.10.2015 under Sections 323, 324, 341, 506, 148 and 149 IPC (Sections 193, 194, 195, 196 and 199 IPC added later on) registered at Police Station Sultanpur Lodhi, District Kapurthala and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed qua the petitioners herein.

Petition stands disposed of.
