Learned counsel for respondent No.4 on instructions from Mr. Sanjay Verma, Superintendent and Mr. Rahul Verma, Deputy Superintendent submits that in compliance of order dated 17.07.2023 (Annexure P-1) passed by the Writ Court, all consequential benefits and arrears admissible to the petitioner along with interest at the rate of 6% per annum shall be paid to him within a period of one week from today.

2. In view of the aforesaid undertaking by learned counsel for the respondent No.4, learned counsel for the petitioner does not press the present petition.

3. Dismissed as not pressed.



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4. Rule stands discharged.
5. However, in case the needful is not done within the
aforementioned period, as per the undertaking, the petitioner would be at
liberty to seek revival of the contempt petition and in that eventuality,
the erring/concerned Officer would be liable to pay Rs.50,000/- as costs
from his/her own pocket in favour of the petitioner towards litigation
expenses, immediately, i.e. on the first date of listing of revival
application.
6. It is made clear that the aforesaid payment shall be
subject to final outcome of an intra Court appeal, if any, filed at the
instance of respondents.
