NAMIT KUMAR, J. (ORAL)

1. The present petition has been filed by the petitioner under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ of mandamus, directing the respondents to release the remaining service-cum-retirement interest on delayed period of service-cum-retirement benefits of the husband of the petitioner, revised pay scale benefits w.e.f 01.01.2006, arrears of salary and pension/revised pension and family pension of deceased husband of petitioner and all other benefits, along with interest for delayed period and for which representation (Annexure P-8) dated 24.05.2022 has also been served by the petitioner.

2. On the last date of hearing, the following order was passed:-

“ In pursuance of order dated 13.11.2024, Mr. Sunil Dutt, Executive Officer, Municipal Council, Gidderbaha, District Muktsar Sahib is present in the Court today.

Learned counsel for respondent No.3 submits that all the retrial dues amounting to Rs. 29,28,788/- have been paid. He seeks one week's time to file the affidavit to this effect, giving details of the payment made to the petitioner.

On his request, adjourned to 19.12.2024.”



3. Short affidavit of Sunil Dutt, Executive Officer, Municipal Council, Gidderbaha, District Sri Muktsar Sahib on behalf of respondent No.3 has been filed and the same is taken on record. Copy thereof has been supplied to the opposite counsel.
4. Learned counsel for the respondent No.3 submits that in view of the statement made on the last of hearing and in view of the averments made in the affidavit, the instant petition has been rendered infructuous.
5. However, learned counsel for the petitioner seeks liberty to move an appropriate application, if any amount is still due, including interest.
6. If the petitioner is still left with some grievances, he would be at liberty to move an appropriate representation to respondent No.3 within a period of one month and decision thereon shall be taken by respondent No.3 within a period of 3 months thereafter.
7. Disposed of in the above terms.
