By way of present petition filed under Section 482 of BNSS
petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case FIR as under:

FIR No.	Dated	Sections	Police Station
77	28.06.2024	22, 29 of NDPS Act.	Dirba, District Sangrur.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in compliance to the order dated 05.11.2024 passed by this Court, the petitioner has already joined the investigation and as such prayed for confirming the interim bail granted vide order dated 05.11.2024.

3. Inspector Kamaldip Singh, SHO P.S. Dirba, District Sangrur, is present in Court and submits that he has joined only on 28.11.2024 and the *pairvi* report was not sent by him.

4. Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Karam Singh, intimates the Court that the petitioner has joined investigation and is neither required for further investigation nor for any custodial interrogation.

5. During the course of hearing on 05.11.2024, following order was passed:

“ 2. Heard.

3. After hearing the respective submissions, it transpires that the petitioner is not named in the FIR nor is there any earlier FIR registered against him under the NDPS Act but has been nominated on the alleged disclosure statement by none other than his own wife from whom the recovery of loose intoxicant tablets was made.

4. ASI Suresh Kumar present in Court submits that except for the disclosure statement there is nothing on record to show that the petitioner is involved in such transaction.

5. Be it the case. Without commenting on the merits of the case, the petitioner is directed to join the investigation within seven days from today and in the event of his arrest, he is ordered to be released on interim bail on his furnishing personal/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer. He shall also abide by conditions as envisaged under Section 482(2) of BNSS, 2023.

6. List on 25.11.2024. ”

6. Keeping in view the above submissions made by learned State counsel and the fact that the petitioner had joined the investigation consequent to the order dated 05.11.2024, passed by this Court, interim bail granted vide order dated 05.11.2024, is hereby confirmed, subject to conditions as envisaged under Section 482 (2) of BNSS, 2023. Further the petitioner is directed to join investigation as and when required in future by way of written notice for such purpose to be served by Investigating Officer of this case upon the petitioner; he will not tamper with the evidence nor will influence the witnesses and will not leave the country without prior permission of the Court.
