

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and have gone through the records of the present case with their able assistance.

The interference of the Court in the transfer matter needs to be minimal unless and until, it is proved beyond doubt that the said transfer has been ordered without jurisdiction or, the same is mala fide, keeping in view the facts presented before the Court.

In the present case, the mala fides being attributed to respondent No.6 is not substantiated. The same is for the reason that the orders have been passed by the State and not by the MLA and in case, the mala fides of respondent No.6 are to be reported, the same are to be included even against the Secretary of the Department, who has passed the order. The petitioner has not chosen to implead her to be part of the conspiracy to transfer him out so as to term the order of transfer mala fide.

Keeping in view of above, no ground is made out to interference in the present petition.

Hence, the present petition is dismissed.

Pending application, if any, also stands disposed of.
