Learned counsel for respondent Nos. 3 & 4, on telephonic
instructions from Sh. Balkaran Singh, SDM, Bathinda, submits that the
amount of compensation deposited with Competent Authority for Land
Acquisition (CALA)-cum-Sub Divisional Magistrate, Bathinda by
respondent No. 2-NHAI shall be released in favour of the petitioner within a
period of ten days from today.

[2] In view of the above, learned counsel for the petitioner does
not press the present petition any further.

[3] Dismissed as not pressed.

[4] However, in case the needful is not done within the afore-stated period, as per undertaking, the petitioner would be at liberty to seek revival of the present contempt petition and in that eventuality, the erring / concerned officer(s) would be liable to pay additional sum of Rs.50,000/- as costs from his/her own pocket in favour of petitioner towards litigation expenses, immediately, i.e. on the first date of listing of revival application.

[5] Rule stands discharged.
