ARUN PALLI, J. (Oral)

With reference to the detailed order that was passed by this Court on October 1, 2024, learned Senior counsel for respondents No.2 & 3 submits, for the Appellate Authority is already in *seisin* of the appeals preferred by the petitioner, which are now posted for October 24, 2024, it would be expedient if the petition is disposed of to enable the authority concerned to consider and decide the said appeals (Nos.I-49 & I-50 of 2024). Accordingly, she submits that the petitioner, through its authorized representative, may appear before the Appellate Authority on the date fixed, i.e. 24.10.2024. And, before any formal orders are passed, it shall be heard. Further, as always, she fairly submits that till any such decision is made, the interim order passed by this Court on October 1, 2024, shall continue to operate.



That being so, learned Senior counsel for the petitioner submits that let the petition be disposed of in terms of the statement made by learned Senior counsel for respondents No.2 & 3. He also fairly reiterates his statement as recorded in the order dated October 1, 2024, that no further construction shall be carried out till the appeals are decided.

In the wake of the position sketched out above, as also the statements of learned Senior counsel for the parties, the petition is accordingly disposed of. This Court is sanguine that the Appellate Authority shall look into the matter in the right earnest. And pass a comprehensive order, assigning reasons in support thereof.

Needless to assert that this order shall not constitute any expression of opinion on the merits of the case of either party, for, as indicated earlier, the Appellate Authority shall examine the concerns/grievances of the petitioner, strictly in accordance with law.
