MANJARI NEHRU KAUL, J. (ORAL)

1. The instant petition is for quashing of FIR No.140, dated 05.07.2013, lodged under Sections 382, 34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 registered at Police Station City Kapurthala, District Kapurthala and all consequential proceedings arising out of the same, on the basis of compromise affidavit (Annexure P-2) arrived at, between the parties.
2. Vide order dated 23.01.2024 of this Court, the parties were directed to appear before the learned trial Court/Illaq Magistrate on 22.02.2024 to get their statements recorded regarding the compromise arrived at, between them.
3. Report has since been received from learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Kapurthala, in pursuance of the directions of this Court, wherein, the factum of the compromise arrived at between the parties stands verified and confirmed. As per the report compromise has indeed been effected between the parties and the

same is without any pressure or coercion and out of their free will and the complainant has also made statement to the effect that she would have no objection if the FIR *qua* the accused-petitioner is quashed.

4. The Trial Court has annexed the copy of statements of the parties, alongwith its report.

5. Learned State counsel too submits that there are no other accused other than the petitioner and respondent No.2 is the only aggrieved person in the FIR in question.

6 In view of the report of the learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Kapurthala and the principles laid down by the Apex Court in *Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and others (2012) 10 SCC 303*, and also by the Full Bench of this Court in *Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another, 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052*, the instant petition is allowed. The aforesaid FIR and all consequential proceedings arising out of it, are quashed qua petitioner.

7. Needless to say the parties shall remain bound by the terms of compromise and their statements recorded before the Court below.
