1. The petitioners through instant petition are seeking direction to the respondents No.2 to 5 not to harass the petitioners and not to call them to the police station without issuance of notice as required under Sections 160 Cr.P.C and 41-A Cr.P.C.

2. The counsel for the petitioners submits that police has falsely implicated son of the petitioners in a criminal case. The petitioners are having no knowledge regarding whereabouts of the petitioners who is presently staying in a foreign country. That petitioners have already informed the same to the police officials of the concerned police station. That despite this, the police officials are time and again raiding the house of the petitioners and are unnecessarily harassing the petitioners.

3. Notice of motion.

4. Mr. J.S. Dhaliwal, AAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents-State and on instructions from ASI Balwant Singh submits that son of the petitioners is required by the police in criminal case having



FIR No.100 dated 30.04.2024 under Section 420 IPC and Section 24 of Immigration Act, Police Station Dasuya. The State counsel further submits that no coercive steps will be taken against the petitioners who are not required by the police in aforesaid criminal case at present. That necessary steps will be taken by the police to arrest son of the petitioners, by following the due procedure prescribed by law.

5. The present petition is hereby disposed of in the light of the aforesaid statement of the State counsel. In case, any assistance of the petitioners is required by the police in aforesaid criminal case, then notice to them is to be sent only as per the prescribed procedure of law. However, nothing expressed herein above is to be construed as expression of opinion on the merits of the case.

6. Petition stands disposed of in aforesaid terms.
