KULDEEP TIWARI, J.(ORAL)

- Through the instant second petition, filed under Section 483 of BNSS, 2023, a prayer is made for grant of relief of regular bail to the petitioner, in case FIR No.34, dated 16.05.2023 (Annexure P-1), under Section 22 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 (Section 61/85 of the NDPS Act, 1985, added later on), registered at Police Station City Banga, SBS Nagar, Punjab.
- Custody Certificate dated 20.10.2024, qua the petitioner, furnished by learned State counsel today, in the Court. The same is taken on record. Copy thereof, supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner.
- Earlier regular bail application preferred by the petitioner, was dismissed as withdrawn, vide order dated 11.07.2024 (Annexure-P-5), on the ground that out of total 10 prosecution witnesses, only one witness was left for examination.

4. Today, learned counsel for the petitioner on asking for the relief (supra), submits that since 11.07.2024, there is no progress in the matter, as on date, and the only witness which was left, has not been examined by the learned trial Court concerned, therefore, the petitioner is entitled for the relief asked for.
5. This Court has considered the submission made by the learned counsel for the petitioner, and is not inclined to grant the relief as asked for. Accordingly, the instant petition is, hereby, **dismissed**.
6. However, a mandamus is passed upon the learned trial Court, concerned, to record the statement of remaining prosecution witnesses, within two months from today.
