SUMEET GOEL, J. (Oral)

1. This petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.314 dated 04.10.2023 registered at Police Station Division ‘B’ District Police Commissionerate, Amritsar, under Sections 306 & 120-B IPC.
2. On 19.10.2023, the following order was passed:-

“The petitioner herein seeks the relief of pre-arrest/anticipatory bail in the criminal case arisen out of the FIR bearing No.314 dated 04.10.2023 registered at Police Station Division ‘B’ District Police Commissionerate, Amritsar, under Sections 306 & 120-B IPC.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, inter-alia, contends that the petitioner is the husband of the sister of the husband of the victim (since deceased) and he has been got falsely implicated in the criminal case under reference whereas in fact, he had no role to play in the alleged crime and even otherwise, no specific allegations have been levelled against the petitioner in the subject FIR and rather, even as per the version canvassed therein (FIR), the husband of the victim was having a dispute with his brother over the property belonging to the family and moreover, the petitioner is ready and willing to join the investigation as and when so required

by the Investigating Agency and is also not involved in any other criminal case.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Virat Rana, learned Assistant Advocate General, Punjab, who has put in appearance in this case in pursuance of the copy of the instant petition having been sent to the respondent-State in advance, accepts the notice and he seeks time to get proper and complete instructions qua the present matter from the quarter concerned and if deemed necessary, then to file the Status-Report also.

Adjourned to 20.02.2024.

Meanwhile, the petitioner shall join in the investigation on 06.11.2023 at 10:00 AM sharp and if there need be, even thereafter and in the event of his arrest, he shall be released on interim bail subject to his furnishing the requisite personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer and he shall also strictly abide by all the conditions as laid down in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

3. Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Jasbir Singh, has stated that pursuant to the order dated 19.10.2023, the petitioner has joined investigation and is no longer required for custodial interrogation.

4. In view of above, the petition is allowed and interim order dated 19.10.2023 passed by this Court is made absolute, subject to the conditions as enumerated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

5. This order should not be treated as “blanket” order. It will not be interpreted as granting petitioner indefinite protection from arrest. It shall be confined to the FIR mentioned *ibid* and will not operate in respect of any other incident that involves commission of an offence.

6. Liberty is reserved in favour of State/complainant to move for cancellation/recall of this order in case the petitioner violates any condition stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C., 1973 or upon showing any other sufficient cause.

7. Needless to say that anything observed herein above shall not be construed to be an opinion on the merits of the case.

8. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
