[1] Status report by way of affidavit dated 15.01.2024 of Shri Jaipal Singh, on behalf of the respondent-State has been filed through Registry. The same is taken on record.

[2] On 08.11.2023, the following order was passed by this Court:-

“ Present: Mr. Mohit, Advocate for the petitioner.
Mr. Randhir Singh, Addl. AG, Haryana.

Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail under Section 438 Cr.P.C in case FIR No.0505 dated 17.09.2023 registered under Sections 18, 61 of NDPS Act, 1985 registered at Police Station City Fatehabad, District Fatehabad.

Allegations are that on 17.09.2023, 01 Kg. of opium was recovered from a car occupied by co-accused Parveen and Anil and in their disclosure statement, they nominated petitioner to be supplier.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that one of the co-accused Anil is his co-villager and that he (petitioner) has been falsely implicated. Learned counsel further contends that petitioner is not involved in any such case and has clean antecedents.

Adjourned to 23.01.2024 for filing status report by respondent- State.

In the meantime, in case of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail subject to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer. However, it is directed that the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when so required by the Investigating

Officer. He shall not contact any person associated with the case to dissuade him from the investigation in any manner whatsoever and nor shall leave the country without prior permission of the Court. He shall further comply with the conditions stipulated in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. ”

[3] Today, learned State Counsel, has informed this Court that the petitioner has joined the investigation, in compliance of the order dated 08.11.2023 and is no longer required for further investigation.

[4] In view of the aforesaid, the order dated 08.11.2023, whereby the petitioner was granted interim anticipatory bail, is hereby made absolute. However, he shall continue to join investigation, if and so required by the Investigating Officer.
