1. The petitioner has filed the Criminal Writ Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India with a prayer to issue a writ in the nature of habeas corpus directing the official respondents to produce the alleged detainee namely Amandeep Singh, husband of the present petitioner, who was allegedly in illegally custody of the private respondents No.7 to 9.
2. A short reply by way of an affidavit of the Senior Superintendent of Police, Bathinda has been filed on behalf of the respondent No.4 and the same is taken on record.
3. Learned State counsel submits that on 30.04.2023, Amandeep Singh had gone to Manikaran Sahib and did not return thereafter. Ultimately, on the basis of the statement made by his mother namely Jaspal Kaur, an FIR No.192 dated 09.09.2023 under Sections 346 and 34 IPC, City Rampura was ordered to be registered against the unknown persons. He further submits that the investigation in FIR No.192 dated 09.09.2023 under

Sections 346 and 34 IPC, City Rampura is being conducted fairly and impartially and every possible effort shall be made to trace Amandeep Singh, husband of the present petitioner.

4. In view of the statement made by the learned State counsel, nothing survives in the present petition and the present petition is accordingly disposed off.

5. Needless to observe that the petitioner is at liberty to avail his alternative remedies, if any, available to him in accordance with law.
