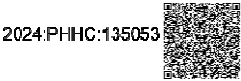

1. Instant writ petition has been filed by the petitioner under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of directions to respondent No.2 – Appellate Authority to decide the common statutory appeal dated 19.09.2023 (Annexure P-5) filed by the petitioner against the punishment orders dated 28.07.2023 (Annexures P-1 to P-4) in a time-bound manner. Further, direction has been sought to respondent No.1 not to effect recovery from the salary of the petitioner pursuant to issuance of orders dated 28.07.2023 (Annexures P-1 to P-4) till the decision of the statutory appeal.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner would be satisfied if time-bound directions are issued to

respondent No.2 to consider and decide the said appeal expeditiously



by passing a speaking order in a time-bound manner and till decision of the said appeal, no recovery may be effected from the petitioner.

- 3. Notice of motion.
- 4. Mr. Sukhdeep Singh, Advocate, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and has no objection if the time-bound directions are issued to the Appellate Authority to consider and decide the appeal filed by the petitioner.
- 5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and have gone through the case file.
- 6. Respondent No.2-Appellate Authority is directed to decide the appeal dated 19.09.2023 (Annexure P-5) filed by the petitioner, in accordance with law by passing a speaking order as expeditiously as possible preferably within a period of six months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. Further recovery from the petitioner shall remain stayed and would be subject to the final order that may be passed by the Appellate Authority.
- 7. Petition stands disposed of.
