[1]. Instant petition has been preferred seeking quashing of the FIR (Annexure P-1), and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 02.08.2023 (Annexure P-2) executed between the parties. Details of the FIR are as under: -

[2]. With the intervention of respectables and elderly people of the society, the parties have arrived at a settlement vide compromise deed dated 02.08.2023 (Annexure P-2), which is duly signed by them. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the

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parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties.

[3]. Learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Faridabad, vide report dated 30.11.2023, has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

[4]. Respondent No. 2 is represented by her counsel and does not oppose the compromise.

[5]. In view of the aforesaid report of the learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Faridabad, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in “Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another”, 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and “Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another”, (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since respondent No. 2 has herself compromised the dispute with the petitioner.

[6]. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. FIR No. 27 dated 03.05.2022 under Sections 419, 420 IPC, registered at Police Station Cyber Crime, Faridabad, Haryana, (Annexure P-1) and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed on the basis of compromise qua the present petitioner.
