1. This is a revision petition filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for setting aside the order dated 01.11.2019 (Annexure P-1) passed by the Additional Civil Judge (Senior Division), Gurugram, whereby an application filed under Order IX Rule 13 read with Order 1 Rule 10 and Section 151 of CPC has been dismissed.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner as well as contesting respondent No.1 have jointly submitted that in the present case, the detailed compromise dated 07.09.2024 which has been placed on record as Annexure C-1 along with CM-18550-CII-2024 has been entered into between the parties and all the disputes between the parties have been settled by virtue of the said compromise and have further submitted that the



compromise has been entered into without any coercion and free will of the parties. It is thus, jointly prayed that the present revision petition be disposed of in terms of the said compromise dated 07.09.2024 (Annexure C-1) and the said compromise be read as a part of the present order.

3. Keeping in view the abovesaid facts and circumstances and joint statement made by both the learned counsel for the parties, the present revision petition is disposed of in terms of compromise dated 07.09.2024 (Annexure C-1) which would be read as a part of the present order. Both the parties would be bound by the terms of the said compromise.

4. All the pending miscellaneous applications, if any, shall stand disposed of in view of the abovesaid order.
