The petitioner has filed the present petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India read with Section 3 of Punjab Prisoners Good Conduct Act seeking issuance of directions in the nature of Mandamus for release of the petitioner on Parole for meeting his family members who are his real sister and brother-in-law.

2. Learned Counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner had lost his parents and since then he has been residing with his real sister and brother-in-law. He, therefore, seeks grant of Parole for a period of 04 weeks.

4. The State Counsel has filed a short reply by way of affidavit dated 08.11.2024 of Ms. Mandeep Kaur, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Nabha, District Patiala. As per the said reply, the factum of the

petitioner having lost his father and residing with his real sister and brother-in-law, has not been disputed by the State.

6. In view of the above, we deem it appropriate to grant the concession of Parole to the petitioner for a period of 04 weeks, enabling him to meet his real sister and brother-in-law. The period of 04 weeks shall commence from the date of release. The petitioner shall surrender before the Jail Authorities on the expiry of period of 04 weeks. After surrender, the petitioner shall furnish a surrender certificate. The State Counsel shall also file a report apprising this Court about the surrender of the petitioner.

7. With the aforesaid observations/directions, the instant petition is disposed of.

8. It is made clear that no further Parole shall be granted to the petitioner and the present concession of Parole shall be treated to be as a last indulgence.
