1. The petitioner has filed the instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking a writ of mandamus, directing the respondents to release 100% provisional pension and all other pensionary benefits as admissible to the post of petitioner and leave encashment in view of the law laid down in **Dr. Ishar Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another : 1993(4) SLR 655** and to release the arrears of revised salary and revised pensionary benefits in view of the recommendations of 6th Punjab Pay Commission along with interest @ 9% per annum.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that since the relief claimed in the present petition has been granted to the petitioner, therefore, the instant petition has been rendered infructuous.
3. Disposed of as having become infructuous.
