2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that as per the case set up by the prosecution, the petitioner had caused an injury with machete (*datar*) on the right leg of Rohit Singh. He further contends that as per MLR (Annexure R-1), Rohit Singh had suffered eight injuries and all injuries were declared to be simple in nature. Learned counsel further contends that as per his information, the injured-Rohit Singh has already discharged from the hospital and is hale and hearty. Even otherwise, the injury attributed to the petitioner is



on non-vital part of the body of the injured. He further submits that the petitioner is ready to join the investigation.

3. On the other hand, in compliance of order dated 23.10.2024 passed by this Court, short Reply by way of an affidavit of Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub-Division Sultanpur Lodhi, District Kapurthala has been filed by learned State counsel in Court today and the same is taken on record. Learned State counsel has vehemently opposed the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner on the ground that serious allegations have been levelled against the present petitioner and he does not deserve the concession of bail by this Court.

4. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the record.

5. In the present case, the petitioner had allegedly caused an injury with sharp edged weapon on the right leg of Rohit Singh and the said injury has been declared to be simple in nature. Even Rohit Singh was discharged from the hospital on the same day.

6. Without commenting any further on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed. The petitioner is granted concession of anticipatory bail, subject to the conditions as provided under Section 482(2) of the BNSS. It will be open for the Investigating Officer to call the petitioner to join investigation, if so required, by issuing a written notice in this regard and he shall abide by the conditions mentioned in Section 482(2) of the BNSS.
