SANDEEP MOUDGIL, J (ORAL)

1. The jurisdiction of this Court has been invoked under Section 439 Cr.P.C., seeking regular bail to the petitioner in FIR No.157, dated 06.11.2020, under Sections 302/307/458 IPC and Section 27 of Arms Act, 1959, registered at Police Station Dayalpura, District Bathinda.

2. Learned counsel for the complainant vehemently contends that the petitioner is the main person, who fired shot, which resulted into death of Rajwinder Kaur and other three gun shots to Darshan Singh, two gun shots to Surinder Pal Singh and two gun shots to Rupinderjit Singh and on the strength of these assertions since dismissal of the instant application attributing high intensity role to the petitioner like that of a hard core criminal. He further states that though the material witnesses have been examined but the allegations against the petitioner by the examined witnesses have also been duly supported by the

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prosecution and other medical evidence placed or exhibited before the trial Court.
As far as the custody period is concerned; looking into the gravity of offence and the role attributed to the petitioner, he does not deserve the concession of regular bail.

- 3. Faced with this situation, learned Senior counsel for the petitioner prays for withdrawal of the present petition.
- 4. Prayer is accepted.
- 5. Dismissed as withdrawn.
