1. Present Civil Writ Petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India praying for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents not to take any further action/proceedings on Departmental Enquiry till the pendency of the criminal proceedings in FIR No. 18 dated 07.08.2023 registered under Section 384 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Section 7 of the PC Act, 1988 at Anti-Corruption Bureau, Hisar.
2. Learned State counsel has submitted that in the present case, all the witnesses in the departmental proceedings have been examined and the final order in the departmental proceedings has been passed and thus, the present petition has been rendered infructuous.
