



Hindu Marriage Act seeking dissolution of marriage by way of mutual consent and the statement of the complainant/respondent No.2 as well as the petitioner was recorded on the first motion and she has even received Rs.3 lakh out of the settled amount and, thereafter, the entire family of the petitioner has been falsely implicated.

The learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Baljeet Singh, submits that there are serious and specific allegations against the petitioner and it is not the case of simplicitor case of dowry harassment. The complainant was five months’ pregnant when she was beaten up. Further, there are allegations of giving injuries to the complainant and one of the injuries has been declared as grievous in nature. The complainant suffered a fracture on her nose and the petitioner has attributed these injuries.

Having heard learned counsel for the parties and on perusal of the records, keeping in view the nature of allegations and the specific attributions to the petitioner, this Court finds no merit to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner and thus, the present petition is hereby dismissed.
