VIKAS BAHL, J.(ORAL)

1. Present Civil Writ Petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India praying for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari for quashing the charge-sheet (Annexure P-4) served by respondent No 4.
2. On 18.12.2023, this Court was pleased to pass the following order:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel have pointed out that in the present case, two common witnesses, out of which, none have been examined and the next date in the criminal case is fixed as 25.01.2024.

Adjourned to 21.02.2024.

The State is directed to produce two common witnesses on 25.01.2024 and the trial Court is directed to examine the said witnesses on the said date or immediately

thereafter. It is further directed that the departmental proceedings would continue, but two common witnesses would not be examined in the departmental proceedings till the next date of hearing.”

2. Learned State counsel has submitted that subsequent to the abovesaid order, two common witnesses have been examined in the criminal case and thus, the present petition has been rendered infructuous.
3. None has appeared on behalf of the petitioner to rebut the said aspect.
4. In view of the above, the present Civil Writ Petition is dismissed for non-prosecution.
