DEEPAK GUPTA, J. (ORAL)

[1] On 30.11.2023, the following order was passed by this Court:-

“ Present: Mr. Ashish Gupta and Varun Gupta, Advocates
for the petitioner.

By way of this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C.,
prayer is made for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.106 dated
20.08.2023, under Section 22(b) of the NDPS Act, 1985 (Section 29 of the
NDPS Act added later on), registered at Police Station Sadar Kot Kapura,
District Fridkot.

As per prosecution allegations, 120 tablets of NRx
Tramadol Hydrochloride were recovered from the possession of co-
accused Jatinder Singh @ Malli, who in his disclosure statement
nominated the petitioner to be the supplier.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the
petitioner has been falsely implicated; that disclosure statement as
suffered by the co-accused is not admissible in the absence of the any
recovery and that the petitioner is ready to join the investigation.

Notice of motion.

Mr. R.S. Khaira, DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of
respondent-State. Copy of paper book be supplied to him during the
course of day.

Learned State counsel submits that the petitioner has
criminal antecedent being involved in three more cases.

Let status report be filed on behalf of respondent-State on
07.02.2204.

In the meantime, petitioner is directed to join investigation and co-operate in the same. He will not leave the country without prior permission of the Court nor shall make any attempt to contact the complainant of the case or any witness associated with the case. In the event of the arrest of the petitioner, he shall be released on interim bail on his furnishing personal/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer. He shall also abide by conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. ”

[2] Today, learned State Counsel, on instructions from HC Gurmeet Kumar, has informed this Court that the petitioner has joined the investigation, in compliance of the order dated 30.11.2023 and is no longer required for further investigation.

[3] In view of the aforesaid, the order dated 30.11.2023, whereby the petitioner was granted interim anticipatory bail, is hereby made absolute. However, he shall continue to join investigation, if and so required by the Investigating Officer.
