1. The present petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 439 Cr.P.C for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.39 dated 10.10.2023 under Section 419, 420 of IPC (Section 201 and 120-B of IPC added later on) at Police Station Cyber Crime NIT, District Faridabad (Annexure P-1).
2. The allegations in nutshell are that complainant-Ritesh Kumar Adhlakha lodged a complaint with the police that some unknown persons committed online fraud with him and they lured the complainant to handover huge amount to them. During investigation, the petitioner and other accused were arrested.
3. Counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has been

falsely implicated in the present case and was arrested on 17.10.2023 and is personally lodged in judicial custody. It is further submitted that now the matter stands compromised with the complainant.

4. The present petition is resisted by the State counsel who submits that the petitioner and other accused persons committed online fraud and defrauded the complainant of Rs.97,978/-. However, the State counsel has not refuted the fact that the FIR in this case was registered against unknown persons and the petitioner was nominated as accused on the basis of disclosure statement of co-accused Mahesh Pal Singh @ Amandeep.

5. Mr. Amit Khari, Advocate for the complainant submits that the matter stands compromised between the parties and the complainant has no objection if the present petition is allowed.

6. In view of the above, no purpose is going to be served by keeping the petitioner in custody for any longer period.

7. Consequently, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail subject to his furnishing bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/CJM/Duty Magistrate concerned, if the petitioner is not required by the police in any other criminal case.
