1. After arguing at length, learned counsel for the petitioner wishes to withdraw the instant petition with liberty to raise all the pleas before the trial Court, at an appropriate stage.
2. Dismissed as withdrawn with liberty aforesaid.
3. At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is a young and an educated lady and is staying all alone. He further contends that the petitioner is having a minor child, who is suffering from Attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) and she is unable to attend the Court proceedings regularly. He further contends that the petitioner has no objection, in case, the Court proceedings are conducted and the evidence is recorded in her absence and in the presence of her counsel and she will not raise any objection during the trial/appeal in this regard.

4.            I have considered the submissions made by the learned counsel for the petitioner.
5.            The personal presence of the petitioner shall remain exempted during the course of the trial in the present case. However, the petitioner shall file an affidavit before the trial Court that she has no objection in case all the proceedings, including the recording of evidence, are held in her absence and in the presence of her counsel and she will not raise any objection in this regard either during the trial or appeal. She will also furnish an undertaking that she will appear as and when directed by the trial Court and shall not leave India without the prior permission of the trial Court. The trial Court shall be at liberty to ensure the presence of petitioner at any stage of trial. Apart from that, the trial Court shall also be at liberty to impose such conditions as it may deem fit and appropriate, in the peculiar facts and circumstances of the present case.
