This petition has been filed under Section 528 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 seeking quashing of FIR No.22 dated 24.02.2024 under Sections 406 & 498-A of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Women Police Station Kurukshetra, District Kurukshetra (Annexure P-1) along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 06.11.2024 (Annexure P-2).

“This petition has been filed under Section 528 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 seeking quashing of FIR No.22 dated 24.02.2024 under Sections 406 & 498-A of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Women Police Station Kurukshetra, District Kurukshetra (Annexure P-1) along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 06.11.2024 (Annexure P-2).

At this stage, on asking of the Court, Ms. Geeta Sharma, DAG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.1-State and Mr. Ajay Beniwal, Advocate accepts notice for respondent No.2 and files Power of Attorney, which is taken on record. Copy of the paper book be supplied to them during course of the day.



Service is complete.
Adjourned to 17.12.2024.

In the meanwhile, the parties are directed to appear before learned trial Court/Illaqa Magistrate within a period of one week from today or any other date convenient to learned trial Court/Illaqa Magistrate, to get their statements recorded regarding compromise and after recording their statements, learned trial Court/Illaqa Magistrate is directed to send report regarding the genuineness of compromise and also to intimate whether any PO proceedings are pending against any of the party on or before the date fixed.

A copy of this order be sent to learned trial Court/Illaqa Magistrate through fax for compliance.”

3. In compliance of the aforesaid order, a report has been received from the concerned jurisdictional Court that the compromise between the parties is genuine and arrived at without any pressure or coercion from anyone.
4. In view of the compromise and the ratio of law laid down by the Hon’ble Supreme Court in ***Narinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and another, (2014) 6 SCC 466, Ramgopal and another Vs. State of Madhya Pradesh 2021 SCC OnLine SC 834*** and ***Shakuntala Sawhney (Mrs) Vs. Kaushalya (Mrs.) and others (1980) 1 SCC 63*** and Full Bench of this Court in ***Kulwinder Singh Vs. State of Punjab 2007 (3) RCR (Crl.) 1052***, this petition is allowed and FIR No.22 dated 24.02.2024 under Sections 406 & 498-A of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Women Police Station Kurukshetra, District Kurukshetra (Annexure P-1) and all consequential proceedings arising out of the same are quashed, qua the petitioner.
