DEEPAK GUPTA, J. (ORAL)

[1] On 08.12.2023, the following order was passed by this Court:-

“ Present: Ms. Kamaldeep Kaur, Advocate for Mr. G.S. Kaura,
Advocate for the petitioner.

By way of present petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C.,
petitioner has prayed for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.84
dated 09.08.2023 registered under Section 379 IPC at Police Station
Malaudh, District Ludhiana.

Allegations are that the petitioner committed theft of a mo-
tor-cycle belonging to complainant Baljeet Singh and that later on, it was
recovered from his house.

It is contended by learned counsel that in fact complainant
had borrowed an amount of `35,000/- from the petitioner. Complainant
failed to return the same and showed his inability and the motor-cycle was
adjusted/sold to the petitioner in respect of the borrowed amount. Learned
counsel further contended that FIR has been lodged under the misunders-
tanding and that no theft has been committed.

Notice of motion.

Mr. P.S. Pandher, AAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of
the respondent- State. Copy of the petition be supplied to him during
course of the day.

Adjourned to 12.02.2024 for filing status report.

In the meantime, in case of his arrest, the petitioner shall be

released on interim bail subject to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/ Investigating Officer. However, it is further directed that the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when so required by the Investigating Officer. He shall not contact any person associated with the case to dissuade him from the investigation in any manner whatsoever and nor shall leave the country without prior permission of the Court. He shall further comply with the conditions stipulated in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. ”

[2] Today, learned State Counsel, has informed this Court that the petitioner has joined the investigation, in compliance of the order dated 08.12.2023 and is no longer required for further investigation.

[3] In view of the aforesaid, the order dated 08.12.2023, whereby the petitioner was granted interim anticipatory bail, is hereby made absolute. However, he shall continue to join investigation, if and so required by the Investigating Officer.
