By way of present petition filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case FIR (Annexure P-1) as under:

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in compliance to the order dated 13.12.2023 passed by this Court, the petitioner has already joined the investigation and as such interim bail granted to the petitioner may be confirmed.
3. Learned State counsel, on instructions from SI Shamsheer has intimated that the petitioner has joined investigation and is no more required for any custodial investigation in this case nor he is required for further investigation.
4. Heard.
5. During the course of hearing on 13.12.2023, the following order was

passed:-

“ 2. It is, inter alia, contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case by converting a civil dispute arising out of agreement to sell dated 23.12.2020 executed between the petitioner and also the complainant qua sale of property. He contends that since the sale deed could not be executed within time, the complainant had got the present FIR registered just to harass the present petitioner. He further contends that the petitioner has not committed any crime; there are no criminal antecedents against the petitioner and he is also ready to join the investigation.

3. Notice of motion.

4. On the asking of the Court, Ms. Gaganpreet Kaur, DAG, Haryana, present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of the State-respondent and prays for time to file the status report/reply in the matter.

5. Mr. Divyam Singh, Advocate, has entered appearance on behalf of Mr. Vikram Singh, learned counsel for the complainant and filed his memo of appearance, the same is taken on record. He contends that the petitioner had taken Rs. 20.00 lacs as earnest money on account of the aforesaid agreement to sell but has not performed his part of the agreement and therefore has cheated the complainant.

6. Adjourned to 18.01.2024

7. Needful be done well before the date fixed with an advance copy to the counsel opposite.

8. In the meanwhile, the petitioner is hereby directed to join investigation within seven days from today and in the event of his arrest, he is ordered to be released on interim bail on his furnishing personal/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer. He shall also abide by conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

6. Keeping in view the above submissions made by learned State counsel and the fact that the petitioner had joined the investigation consequent to the order dated 13.12.2023 passed by this Court, interim bail granted vide order dated 13.12.2023 is hereby confirmed, subject to conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. Further the petitioner is directed to join investigation as and when required in future by way of written notice for such purpose to be served

by Investigating Officer of this case upon the petitioner; he will not tamper with the evidence nor will influence the witnesses and will not leave the country without prior permission of the Court.

7. The petition stands allowed.
