AMARJOT BHATTI, J.

1. Petitioner Anil Kumar has filed criminal writ petition under Article 226 of Constitution of India for issuance of direction to respondent Nos.2 to 4 to protect his life and liberty as well as of his family from the hands of respondent Nos.5 to 8 and for any other appropriate direction which the Court may deem fit.

2. In the petition there is reference of CCTV footage of BTM Police Post, Bhiwani dated 19.04.2023 between 10 am to 5 pm. He has referred to the proceedings in CRM-M-22078-2023 (P-1) and status report filed in that case is Annexure P-2. One FIR No.609 dated 09.12.2023 under Sections 294, 323, 342 of IPC was registered against respondent No.5 in Police Station City Bhiwani, which is Annexure P-4. Present petitioner apprehends threat from the hands of respondent No.5 to 8. Hence the present petition.

3. Notice of motion in this petition was issued on 18.12.2023. There is status report filed by respondent No.3 dated 20.12.2023 according



to which respondent No.5 - HC Sanjay has been transferred from Police Post BTM Bhiwani for fair and impartial investigation. There is also reference of previous criminal antecedents of petitioner detailed in para No.2 on merits, according to which there is reference of as many as 6 FIRs registered against present petitioner. Since there is no representation filed by petitioner, therefore, protection petition filed by petitioner deserves dismissal.

4. I have considered the petition as well as status report. HC Sanjay respondent No.5 has already been transferred. He is also apprehending threat from the hands of respondent Nos.6 to 8. In the status report, there is reference of various criminal cases registered against the present petitioner. Even then it is the duty of police to protect life and liberty of petitioner as well as his family from any untoward incident.

5. Considering the aforesaid factual position, petitioner is at liberty to file representation before respondent Nos.3 and 4 and after considering threat perceptions adequate measures will be taken.

6. Petition is, accordingly, disposed of.

7. Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, stand disposed of accordingly as well.

8. This order will have no bearings on any civil or criminal litigation against present petitioner.
