SHEEL NAGU, CHIEF JUSTICE (Oral)

The petitioners, who are two in number, apprehend their arrest in respect of offences punishable under Sections 115 (2), 127 (2), 190, 191 (3), 351 (2) and 117 (2) [added later on by deleting 118 (1)] of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, registered vide FIR No. 720 dated 23.08.2024 at Police Station Palla, District Faridabad.

2. The facts reveal that complainant Roshan Kumar and daughter of petitioner No.1 had developed relationship, which was not to the liking of the petitioners and, therefore, when the complainant visited home of the petitioners on their invitation, he was assaulted.

3. As per the MLR, the complainant received simple injuries on his body. Since the petitioners have no criminal antecedents, possibility of their fleeing from justice is not there, therefore, this Court extends the benefit of anticipatory bail to the petitioners subject to their furnishing personal bonds for a sum of Rs. 50,000/- each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioners shall

join investigation as and when called upon to do so and cooperate with the Arresting/Investigating Officer and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 482 (2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023. In case the petitioners do not join the investigation, the State is free to move an application for cancellation of their bail.

4. This order shall also remain subject to the following condition :-

“Each of the petitioner shall plant 10 saplings of indigenous plants at a public place and submit proof in that regard by way of photographs before the concerned Police Station where the FIR has been registered within a period of 15 days and if there is no such intimation submitted or intimation is found to be incorrect, then the State can move an application for cancellation of their bail.”

5. Petition stands allowed.
