1. The instant petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for quashing of FIR No.379 dated 07.10.2021, under Sections 306, 34 IPC, 1860, registered at Police Station Patran, District Patiala (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise deed dated 21.11.2023 (Annexure P-2), executed between the parties.

2. The first informant has alleged in the FIR that she is a labourer and having 05 children including the victim-deceased. On 04.10.2021, when the informant and her son were doing labour work in the Grain Market, they received a phone call from the victim informing that petitioner No.1-Mangat Ram (Sukhveer Singh @ Mangtu Ram) and petitioner No.2-Satpal Ram had exchanged the photographs of the victim, due to which, she has been defamed and she is going to end her life by jumping in the Bhakra Canal in order to save herself from defamation. When the first informant and her son reached home, they found



that the victim was not present in the house. They searched for her on the motorcycle but she could not be found. On 07.10.2021, the dead body of the daughter of the first informant was found from Gurudwara near Jogewal Canal in Bhakra. It is alleged in the FIR that the daughter of the first informant has ended her life being harassed by the petitioners.

3. Learned State counsel has opposed the present petition and it has been contended that investigation is complete and final report (*challan*) under Section 173 Cr.P.C. has been presented before the trial Court.

4. Today, no one has put in appearance on behalf of the petitioners. Even on 20.12.2023 and 23.02.2024, no one had appeared on behalf of the petitioners. It seems that the petitioners have lost interest in the present petition and do not want to pursue the same.

5. Consequently, the present petition stands dismissed for non-prosecution.

6. Pending miscellaneous applications, if any, shall stand disposed of.
