Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners are entitled the benefit of the judgment passed in **CWP No.17064 of 2017**, decided on 16.02.2023, titled '**Ajay Kumar Singla and others Vs. State of Punjab and others**', as the petitioners are entitled for the benefit of full salary from initial date of their appointment.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners further submits that the petitioners have already served a legal notice dated 24.07.2024 claiming the said benefit, copy of which has been appended as Annexure P-9 but the same is still pending consideration with the respondents and the petitioners will be satisfied, at this stage, in case a time bound direction is issued to the respondents to decide the same by passing an appropriate speaking order.

4. On the asking of the Court, Mr. Amarpreet Singh Bains, AAG,



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Punjab, who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents-State and submits that in case, legal notice dated 24.07.2024 (Annexure P/9) has been received in the office of the respondents and the same is still pending consideration with the authorities concerned, the same will be decided by the competent authority within a period of eight weeks from the date of the receipt of copy of this order by passing an appropriate speaking order and in case, it is found feasible to accept the claim of the petitioners, the same will be accepted, otherwise due reasons for not accepting the claim of the petitioners will be mentioned in the speaking order so passed, which order will be conveyed to the petitioners for their information and necessary action.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that keeping in view the statement of learned counsel for the respondents, the present petition may kindly be disposed of having been not pressed any further.
