1. The instant petition has been filed by the petitioner for quashing the order dated 28.10.2024 passed by learned Judicial Magistrate First Class, Gurugram in case bearing CIS No NACT/10221/2019 titled as '*Punjab National Bank vs. M/s Jai Shree Radhey Etc.*', whereby learned trial Court had admitted the petitioner to bail in compliance of order dated 23.10.2024 passed by this Court in case bearing CRM-M-53034-2024 subject to her furnishing personal/surety bonds to the tune of Rs.40,000,00/-.

2. It is submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that the amount of the personal bonds as well as surety bonds as directed to be furnished by the petitioner is exorbitantly high and she is not in a position to furnish the same. It is, therefore, argued that the impugned order may either be quashed or be modified and the amount of bonds to be furnished by the petitioner may be ordered to be reduced. A perusal of records shows that vide

order dated 23.10.2024 passed by this Court in case CRM-M-53034-2024, a



direction had been given to the petitioner to surrender before the trial Court on or before 28.10.2024 and on her doing so, she was ordered to be admitted to bail subject to furnishing bonds as well as surety bonds to the satisfaction of learned trial Court.

3. In compliance with the aforesaid order passed by this Court, the petitioner has appeared before the learned trial Court and has been admitted to bail. However, she has been directed to furnish personal bonds in the sum of Rs.40,00,000/- with one surety in the like amount vide impugned order dated 28.10.2024. The amount of Rs.40,00,000/- which is ordered to be furnished by way of surety bonds is quite high and in the considered opinion of this Court also the same is liable to be reduced as the petitioner is obviously not in a position to arrange surety for such a huge amount. Therefore, the order dated 28.10.2024 as passed by learned trial Magistrate is modified and it is hereby directed that the petitioner shall furnish surety bonds to the tune of Rs.1,00,000/- only within a period of ten days from today before the learned trial Court. She has already furnished personal bonds.

4. Accordingly, the petition stands disposed of.
