JASJIT SINGH BEDI, J. (ORAL)

On 21.12.2023 the following order was passed:-

“ *The Prayer in this petition under Section 482 Cr.PC is for the quashing of the order dated 13.12.2023 (Annexure P-1) passed by Judge Special Court, Amritsar in case FIR No.66 dated 3.3.2021 under Section 21(b) of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act registered at P.S. B-Division, District Amritsar vide which the petitioner has been declared a proclaimed offender.*

The Counsel for the petitioner contends that on account of noting down of a wrong date, he was unable to appear on 12.07.2023 consequent to which the impugned order came to be passed. He states that petitioner is ready and willing to join the proceedings once again.

Notice of motion for 01.03.2024.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to surrender before the Trial Court within a period of one week from today and subject to a deposit of Rs.50,000/- as costs with the Punjab & Haryana High Court Bar Association Chandigarh Lawyers Family

Welfare Fund Account No.41564846387, State Bank of India, High Court Branch, Chandigarh he shall be admitted to interim bail to the satisfaction of the Trial Court.

The petitioner is further directed to place on record the photocopy of receipt of payment as well as the order passed by the court below granting interim bail to the petitioner.”

Thereafter on 11.01.2024 the following order was passed:-

“ This is an application for extending the time to furnish the bail bonds pursuant to the order dated 21.12.2023.

For the reasons mentioned in the application, the same is allowed. The petitioner is directed to surrender before the Trial Court within a period of one weeks from today in terms of order dated 21.12.2023.

This application stands disposed of.”

In reference to the aforementioned orders the petitioner has surrendered and has since been released on interim bail on 16.01.2024. He has also deposited the costs as imposed by this Court vide order dated 29.04.2023.

In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed by this Court.

Disposed of.

However, it is made clear that the petitioner shall continue to appear before the Trial Court and shall not absent himself without any sufficient cause.
