DEEPAK GUPTA, J. (ORAL)

[1] On 22.12.2023, the following order was passed by this Court:-

“ Present: Mr. Karajveer Singh, Advocate for the petitioners.

By way of present petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C., petitioner has prayed for grant of concession of pre-arrest bail in case FIR No.176 dated 28.09.2023 registered under Sections 22/29 (Act No.61 of 1985) of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (for short, 'the NDPS Act') at Police Station Garhshankar, District Hoshiarpur, Punjab.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that on the basis of secret information to the effect that some persons were selling intoxicant injections, 11 persons were nabbed by the police and separate recoveries were effected from them. Learned counsel contends further that the petitioners are not named in the FIR and their names have surfaced only on the basis of the disclosure statement of co-accused, without specifying any role. Learned counsel contends further that petitioners are involved in three more cases of the NDPS Act, but in all the three cases, they are on bail.

Notice of motion.

Mr. M.S. Nagra, AAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent- State. Copy of paper book be supplied to him during the course of the day.

Adjourned to 12.02.2024 for filing status report.

In the meantime, in case of their arrest, the petitioners shall be released on interim bail subject to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/ Investigating Officer. However, it is further directed that the petitioners shall join the investigation as and when so required by the Investigating Officer. They shall not contact any person associated with the case to dissuade them from the investigation in any manner whatsoever and nor shall leave the country without prior permission of the Court. They shall further comply with the conditions stipulated in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

[2] Today, learned State Counsel, has informed this Court that the petitioner has joined the investigation, in compliance of the order dated 22.12.2023 and is no longer required for further investigation.

[3] In view of the aforesaid, the order dated 22.12.2023, whereby the petitioner was granted interim anticipatory bail, is hereby made absolute. However, she shall continue to join investigation, if and so required by the Investigating Officer.
