1. Present writ petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to rectify the seniority list of petitioner dated 09.05.2023 (Annexure P-2) vide which date of promotion as Assistant Sub Inspector is showing w.e.f. 15.04.2017 whereas the petitioner was promoted as Assistant Sub Inspector on 25.10.2011.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner has given a representation dated 06.10.2023 (Annexure P-3) against the tentative seniority list and at this stage, the petitioner would be satisfied in case competent authority of the respondents-State considers the same in accordance with law, within a specified time frame and in case the pleas raised by the petitioner are found to be meritorious, then,

grant the appropriate relief to the petitioner.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the respondents has submitted that competent authority of the respondents-State would consider the said representation dated 06.10.2023 (Annexure P-3), filed by the petitioner, in accordance with law and the same would be done within a period of two months from the date of certified copy of this order.

4. Keeping in view the above-said facts and circumstances, the present petition is disposed of, with a direction to competent authority of the respondents-State to consider the representation dated 06.10.2023 (Annexure P-3) filed by the petitioner within a period of two months from the date of receipt of the certified copy of this order and in case competent authority of the respondents-State is of the view that the pleas raised by the petitioner are meritorious, then, the appropriate relief be granted to the petitioner as expeditiously as possible. In case, competent authority of the respondents-State is of the view that the pleas raised by the petitioner are meritless, then, a speaking order rejecting the claim be passed within the aforesaid period of two months.

5. It is made clear that this Court has not opined on the merits of the case and competent authority of the respondents-State would consider and decide the matter independently, in accordance with law.
