The learned counsel representing the petitioner contends that the petitioner is the registered owner of the truck, which was allegedly involved in transporting the dead cows. He submits that the petitioner is sought to be implicated on the basis of a disclosure statement of the co-accused, which is not admissible in evidence.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Yuvraj Shandilya, Assistant Advocate General, Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of the State.

Adjourned to 21.02.2024.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on the interim bail subject to furnishing personal bonds and surety to the satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions of bail as provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

3. Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Daya Chand, submits that in compliance of order dated 01.01.2024 passed by this Court, the petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for further custodial interrogation.
4. Keeping in view the statement made by learned State Counsel the order dated 01.01.2024, is made absolute. The petitioner shall abide by the terms and conditions enumerated in Section 438(2) of Cr.P.C.
5. The petition is accordingly allowed.
