AMARJOT BHATTI, J.

Petitioner-Paryesh Kumar @ Prince alias Priyesh Kumar has filed the present petition under Section 528 BNSS for quashing of impugned order dated 18.11.2024 (Anneuxre P-5) passed by learned Additional Sessions Judge, Ludhiana, whereby his bail order has been cancelled and the bail bonds/surety bonds are forfeited to the State in FIR No.25, dated 05.02.2021, under Sections 379-B, 411 and 34 of IPC registered at Police Station Sadar, District Ludhiana.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner pointed out that he was arrested in this case on 05.02.2021 and was granted bail on 09.03.2021 by the Court of Additional Sessions Judge, Ludhiana, (Annexure P-2). He was regularly appearing before the trial Court. However, on 04.11.2024 he was marked absent, as a result his arrest warrants were issued for 18.11.2024 and on 18.11.2024 his arrest warrants received back unexecuted and the



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same are again issued for 12.12.2024. It is pointed out that petitioner noted wrong date, as a result, he could not appear before the trial Court. In fact, there was no intentional absence on his part. He is ready to face trial and abide by the terms of conditions imposed by this Court.

3. Notice of motion.

4. On asking of this Court, Mr. Kewal Singh, Addl.A.G. Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of State.

5. I have considered the arguments advanced by learned counsel for the petitioner. In the case in hand, petitioner missed one date on 04.11.2024, as a result his arrest warrants have been issued for 18.11.2024. On 18.11.2024, his arrest warrants have been received back unexecuted. Petitioner has approached this Court without any delay. He should have filed application seeking exemption of personal appearance which he failed.

6. However, taking a lenient view, petitioner is directed to surrender before the learned trial Court within 10 days from today and be released on bail to the satisfaction of trial Court/duty Magistrate concerned subject to the deposit of Rs.15,000/- with District Legal Services Authority, Ludhiana, failing which trial Court may proceed as per law.

7. Petition is accordingly allowed.
