JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J (ORAL)

1. The petitioners through instant petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India are seeking direction to official respondents to release service/terminal dues of Kashmir Singh.

2. The petitioner Nos. 1 and 2 are children of late Kashmir Singh who passed away on 21.03.2024 while in service. He was part of Punjab Police Force. His wife passed away on 02.01.2012 and he solemnized second marriage with respondent No. 5 in April' 2012. After the death of Kashmir Singh, a dispute erupted between petitioners and respondent No. 5 with respect to terminal benefits of Kashmir Singh. Both the parties filed multiple petitions against each other. Matter was finally settled between the parties and a compromise deed dated 29.05.2024 (Annexure P-3) was executed. Both the parties, as per compromise deed, withdrew their petitions pending before the Courts.

3. Mr. Virinder K. Shukla, Advocate submits that matter has been amicably settled between petitioners and respondent No. 5 and they have



approached Authorities to release terminal dues of Kashmir Singh but to no avail. The Authorities are sitting over the matter and petitioners are deprived from their valuable rights since 2014.

9. Notice of motion.
10. Mr. Aman Dhir, DAG, Punjab who on advance notice is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of respondent-State and waives service.
11. With the consent of both sides, the matter is taken up for final disposal.
12. Mr. Aman Dhir, DAG, Punjab submits that there is no delay on the part of respondents. Parties have settled their dispute in May’ 2024 and thereafter approached Authorities. They have not submitted requisite documents. They may be directed to appear before Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran so that they may not indulge in further litigation.
13. Faced with this, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that petitioners as well as respondent No. 5 would appear before Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran on 24.12.2024 and shall tender their statement with respect to compromise. They would also submit requisite documents.
14. In the wake of statement of both sides, the present petition stands disposed of. It is made clear that as soon as petitioners and respondent No. 5 would appear before Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran and submit requisite documents, their claim would be adjudicated expeditiously.
15. Disposed of accordingly.
