1. The petitioner apprehending her arrest has filed this petition under Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023 seeking anticipatory bail in case FIR No. 111, dated 11.07.2024 under Sections 447, 379, 427, 511 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 registered at Police Station Chheharta, District Police Commissionerate, Amritsar.
2. The petitioner has no antecedents and is alleged with house trespass and theft. The petitioner and the complainant are neighbour agriculturists and because of past animosity, the present incident appears to have been committed.
3. Merely on the ground that the petitioner has no antecedents and is aged about 57 years and there is no possibility of her fleeing from justice and learned counsel for the petitioner has also assured that the petitioner shall follow all the terms and conditions for granting anticipatory bail, this Court for the time being is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner subject to

her furnishing personal bonds for a sum of Rs. 50,000/- with two sureties of Rs. 25,000/- each to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join investigation as and when called upon to do so and cooperate with the Arresting/Investigating Officer and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 482(2) of the BNSS. In case the petitioner does not join the investigation, the State is free to move an application for cancellation of her bail.

4. This order shall also remain subject to the following condition:-

The petitioner shall plant 10 saplings of indigenous plants at a public place and submit proof in that regard by way of photographs before the concerned Police Station where the FIR has been registered within a period of 15 days and if there is no such intimation submitted or intimation is found to be incorrect, then the State can move an application for cancellation of her bail.
5. The petition stands disposed of.
